
Projects 2014

Annually, Friends of the Capitol undertakes numerous projects in support of developing, preserving, restoring, and making accessible artworks within the Capitol Art Collection. Oklahoma's state house art collection is comprised of more than one hundred permanent sculptures, murals and paintings located throughout the Capitol's hallways, rotunda, and grounds. In addition to enriching a historic civic space, the collection provides thousands of visitors and students a unique and engaging way to learn about Oklahoma's history through the events, people and land depicted in the works.

Commissioning and Unveiling of Ralph Ellison Portrait

Friends of the Capitol served as fiscal agent on the commissioning, installation, and dedication of a portrait of iconic Oklahoma author Ralph Ellison. The oil on linen portrait by Oklahoma native Tracey Harris was dedicated on March 6, 2014 during a ceremony held in the Capitol's fourth floor rotunda.

The development and execution of the portrait was a shared endeavor. Friends of Capitol oversaw project revenues and expenditures while the Oklahoma Arts Council coordinated the commissioning of the portrait and selection of the artist. The Council also developed educational support materials and programming for the public. Fundraising was spearheaded by Robert Henry and Senator David Holt. The project was authorized and completed under the direction of the State Capitol Preservation Commission. The project was completed at a cost of \$14,777.75 and will, along with the other portraits of iconic Oklahomans lining public spaces, serve as an educational tool for thousands of children and visitors who tour the Capitol each year.

Allan Houser at the Capitol: A Legacy in Bronze

A special exhibit on the grounds of the Oklahoma State Capitol, Allan Houser at the Capitol: A Legacy in Bronze was part of a statewide celebration of the 100th anniversary of the birth of renowned Oklahoma artist Allan Houser. Born June 30, 1914, Houser's impact on Native American art as a form of expression made him one of the 20th century's most influential artists. Through December 15, 2014, visitors to the Capitol could view five temporary, large-scale bronze sculptures created by Houser along with his permanent Capitol sculpture, As Long as the Waters Flow, and learn more about Houser's life and legacy. A cell phone audio tour accompanying the exhibit was also available. Friends of the Capitol donated \$10,000 to help defray costs of transporting and installing the Houser artworks for the exhibition at the Capitol.

Dedication of Niche Sculptures

In 2000, prominent Oklahoma sculptors were invited to submit clay maquettes showcasing their designs to be considered for placement atop the soon-to-be finished Capitol dome. The winning sculpture was Senator Enoch Kelly Haney's now famous, "The Guardian," a colossal 21-foot bronze version of which now stands prominently atop the Oklahoma State Capitol dome since it was lifted on June 7, 2002.

The other submissions, each unique and beautiful in their own right, told their own stories of Oklahoma's proud Native community. In recognition of these masterful



works, and in coordination with the State Capitol Preservation Commission, Friends of the Capitol commissioned bronze replicas of the maquettes for placement in niches throughout the state house. On May 7, 2014, Friends of the Capitol celebrated Arts Day at the Capitol with many other numerous organizations and held a public dedication ceremony for the five newest additions to the Capitol Art Collection. The total cost of the statues was \$14,348.68.

Through December of 2014, 3467 pavers have been engraved with the names of dedicated Oklahomans. Add yours to our growing list today!






